What is one nickname for softball?	serve as a bat. He shouted, "Let's play ball" Softball was played with a larger ball, indoors, and was known as "indoor baseball". It was intended as a sort of substitute for baseball, a way of keeping in shape during the winter months. Nicknames for softball include: Kitten ball, army ball, mush ball, indoor-outdoor, recreation ball and playground ball. What is a Grand Slam?	<ul> <li>between 2nd base and 3rd base and acts as a cutoff for left field.</li> <li>7- Left Field (LF)- Covers the outfield from 3rd base foul line to 2nd base.</li> <li>8- Center Field (CF)- Covers the mid outfield section and also backs up right/left fielders</li> </ul>		
Can you "steal" in PE?	<ul> <li>9- Right Field (RF)- Covers the outfield from the 1st base foul line to 2nd base.</li> <li><u>Terminology</u></li> <li>Batting order- order in which players must bat.</li> </ul>		
What are 2 ways for a batter to get out?	<ul> <li>Force Out-when a fielder has possession of the ball at a base where the base runner was forced to run- do not need to tag runner.</li> <li>Foul Ball- a ball that first touches an object or player outside of the foul line. It is considered a strike on the batter, if the batter has less than a two strike count Grand Slam- a home run with bases loaded.</li> <li>Inning- the portion of the game when the teams alternate in the field and at bat. Each team gets three outs. Typically a softball game is played with 7 innings.</li> </ul>		
What is a strikeout?	<ul> <li>Lead-off batter- first batter in an inning.</li> <li>Line Drive- a hard hit ball that travels parallel to the ground.</li> <li>Stealing- a base runner advances to the next base before the batter hits the ball.</li> <li>(This is not allowed in PE)</li> <li>Strike Zone- that space over any part of home plate between the batter's</li> </ul>		
	<ul> <li>shoulders and knees.</li> <li>Strike- A pitched ball that is swung at and missed by the batter: or crosses through the strike zone without swinging. Three strikes = 1 out</li> <li>Ball- A thrown ball by the pitcher that is not in the strike zone. Four balls= a walk.</li> </ul>		
	<b>Tag-up-</b> A base runner goes from his/her base to the next base after a fly ball is caught. The runner cannot run until is caught.		

What is a Fly Out?	<ul> <li>When is a Batter Out (most common outs) <ul> <li>Strike Out- 3 strikes</li> <li>Tag Out- Runner is tagged with the ball before reaching a base.</li> <li>Fly Out- Ball is caught in the air.</li> <li>Forced Out- Runner has to run to next base and defensive player touches base before runner.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Other OUTS <ul> <li>Leaves base before the ball leaves the pitcher's hand</li> <li>Runner interferes with a field trying to field ball.</li> <li>A runner passes another base runner.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Base Running <ul> <li>Runners must touch bases in order.</li> <li>Runners may overrun 1st base only, all other bases the runner may be tagged out if they are off base.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

List one Hitting Technique	<ul> <li>PE Rules</li> <li>Pitch to your own team. Play stops when the defense throws ball into the pitcher.</li> <li>Only 3 pitches per batter.</li> <li>If a batted ball hits pitcher, the batter is out.</li> <li>No stealing.</li> <li>No bunting- if defensive team does not have enough players for a catcher.</li> <li>Bat must be placed inside hula hoop or else batter is out.</li> </ul>
